



A British Columbia Land Surveyor is an individual commissioned as a land surveyor by the Association of British Columbia Land Surveyors and, as such, is authorized to carry out legal surveys within

British Columbia. Many British Columbia Provincial statutes specifically designate B.C. Land Surveyors as the only persons entitled to perform legal surveys of land pursuant to the particular Act.

Land Surveyors enter the profession after undergoing a rigorous pre-professional education and subsequent training as an articulated pupil. Many BC Land Surveyors have obtained university degrees in geomatics and survey sciences prior to pursuing their careers as a land surveyor, while many others have acquired technical diplomas in survey technologies during the course of their education.

As a result, the British Columbia Land Surveyor is well grounded in the science of surveying and the application of this knowledge in service to their clients.

You can obtain your commission as a BCLS by:

- Completing a geomatics program at BCIT (www.bcit.ca/construction/geomatics) or through CCLS accredited programs in land surveying and geomatics programs at the University of Calgary (www.geomatics.ucalgary.ca) or the University of New Brunswick (gge.unb.ca).
- Applying to the Canadian Board of Examiners for Professional Surveyors for a Certificate of Completion, or completing examinations in any required fields.
- Entering a period of Articles with a land surveyor to obtain practical work experience.
- Completing the professional examinations.



Students enrolled at BCIT, University of Calgary, University of New Brunswick or other technical diploma programs in geomatics may apply for a free Survey Student membership with the Association of BC Land Surveyors.

Survey students receive our quarterly Link magazine, can attend seminars, and may receive article time credits for accredited studies and summer employment.

Students may obtain financial assistance through regular student financial programs and by scholarships available from the BC Land Surveyors Foundation and other private survey firms.
